

It is with great pleasure that I introduce Anita Houldsworth to the Wattle Flat community as the principal for 2024.


Anita comes to the community with invaluable leadership experience and is looking forward to working with the students, staff, parents and community to continue the great work that is occurring each and every day at WFPS.


INFANTS
