Our year 6 leaders have their guessing competition back for term 4. All funds raised will go towards a suprise at the end of term 4.



INFANTS



This week we have been looking at length and area in Kindergarten. Students have been talking about and ordering objects from longest to shortest or biggest to smallest. Students have been developing their number sense knowledge by building towers with blocks.







During literacy, we have been practising the beginning, middle and end sounds of words in phonics as well as swapping sounds around to make rhyming words. Students are also doing a fabulous job using vocabulary from some of the picture books we have been reading and using it in their own writing.









PRIMARY

Students have been finishing off their novel studies from last term. Through text studies we have been having excellent discussions about characters feeling, making connections, as well as more complex ideas such as 'theme' and 'metaphor'. We have been revising narratives and have begun to plan and
